MATTER OF FACT

Rev. W. Arthur Shepherd was pastor of this church from 1922 until 1926. He was one of two men ordained on April 24, 1921 and he became pastor of this same church less than a year later. Rev. Shepherd resigned in 1926 to attend Southern Seminary.

In 1944 at age 55, he was pastor at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church. In December of that year, he and his wife (Mary) were involved in a near fatal accident (hit by drunk driver) coming home from church. It was so critical, his son Allen was called home from his Naval service in the war on Iwo Jima. Rev. and Mrs. Shepherd both suffered permanent injuries, which prohibited him from holding a pastorate. He was able to return to FBC-WC to teach Sunday School in the late 1940s. He also preached upon request from time to time until his death in 1959. Rev. Shepherd was the father-in-law of church member Grace Shepherd and grandfather of Greg Shepherd.
